

The Festival was kicked off by a welcome dinner on Nov 6 at Supatra River House. We all enjoyed a delicious Thai cuisine hosted by Boston University Alumni Association Thailand (BUAATH). During the dinner, we had a golf competition prize giving session for the winners who played at the Royal Golf & Country Club earlier.

Did you know?

Thai cuisine blends 5 tastes: sweet, spicy, sour, bitter, and salty. Some common ingredients used in Thai cuisine include garlic, chilies, lime juice, lemon grass, and fish sauce. The staple food in Thailand is rice, particularly jasmine variety rice.



After that, we enjoyed the Loy Krathong Festival. What is Loy Krathong Festival? "Loy" means "to float". "Krathong" is a raft about a handspan in diameter traditionally made from a section of a banana tree trunk, decorated with elaborately-folded banana leaves flowers, candles, incense sticks, etc. During the night of the full moon, these small rafts are released on a river. Many Thai believe that floating a krathong will create good luck, and they do it to honor and thank the Goddess of Water. It is originally held on the full moon of the 12th month in the

traditional Thai lunar calendar. In western calendar this usually falls in November, unfortunately we missed

it. In order to let us experience this traditional Thai culture, our very thoughtful alumni association in Thailand arranged this special cultural event for us. Therefore, we all had a chance to participate in the event and made our wishes by floating our

own krathong on the river. Hope our wishes come true!


