Most significantly, Mr. Chen Ang and Mr. T.C. Tan ascertained that BUAA Singapore and BUAA Malaysia will jointly host the 2012, 4th Asian Alumni Business Forum in Singapore. Mr. Ang will later post a survey on the event's website and social networking sites for your reference. Tentatively, the 4th BU Business Forum will be focused on the US Economy and Euro Zone issues. During the meeting, Mr. Ken Kondo also suggested that it might be useful to hold an industry-specific Business Forum. What do you think? We would love to hear your ideas or suggestions for a more fruitful business forum. Please kindly contact us for any comment.

The committee also discussed the next destination of the BU Asian Alumni Festival in 2014. Beijing may be a possibility. Also,

we were recommended to consider India; Jakarta; or a destination resort town, such as Bali. We haven't drawn any conclusions yet. We will definitely keep you posted with the decision later.

Due to the serious flooding in Bangkok, many Thai alumni could not attend the Festival this year. Mr. Subhajati and his wife were the only representatives of Thailand this time. During the meeting, Mr. Subhajati talked about the situation in Bangkok. It has caused a lot of damage to almost every sector such as agriculture, industry, tourism and trading etc. He requested support for his country and to initiate a Disaster Relief Fund. Mr. Tan mentioned he could support such an idea by passing on to contacts at Malaysia-Thailand Business Association. We also send our condolences to those affected by the disaster, and hope for a speedy recovery.

Meanwhile, we discussed how to raise the philanthropic spirit among alumni to BU. Mr. YJ Han mentioned we need to establish a steering committee to come up with targets and ways to draw attention from large donors to BU fund raising efforts, thus raising the participation rates.

Finally, Ms. Jean Liu would like to say thanks to everyone for coming to the event, and we again would also like to thank BUAA Taipei, BU Foundation and the organizing committee for their hospitality and warm welcome. See you all again in Singapore!
